Grading Policies

TESTS & QUIZZES 55%

Tests given at the end of a chapter or section with ample notice. Quizzes are given with at least 1 day of notice. The quiz average at the end of the marking period will count as a test grade. Quizzes and tests will not occupy an entire block period. NO SURPRISE QUIZZES!

LABS

10%

This grade is based on your ability to work cooperatively in your group and not "slack off" during the double period lab time. This grade includes your results AS WELL AS your lab participation! Your grade for each lab will be a combination of your lab write-up/results AS WELL AS a lab "attitude" grade. What you must remember is that a laboratory experiment MAY NOT always give you the perfect results. Even history's greatest scientists had bad lab days.

HOMEWORK

10%

Given and checked and collected on a regular basis!

CLASS ATTITUDE 5%

Includes class participation and preparation! Each class, you will be able to earn a maximum of 3 points. The three "P's" of classwork are "preparation, productivity and purpose. You will earn a point for being prepared (pencil/calculator/notebook), a point for being productive (not sleeping, being engaged and participation), and a point for being purposeful in class (not having phone out, not taking too long to go to the bathroom). Your grade at the end of the MP will be the average of all of these points.

QUARTERLY EXAM 20%

This is a summative assessment at the end of each marking period on the material covered during that marking period. The format of the test will be multiple choice, short answer and open ended test. Although the exams are not cumulative, the chemistry course is a cumulative course. This means that material we will cover in the first marking period will be necessary to retain later in the school year.

EXTRA CREDIT

Once in a while on a test. Do NOT depend on it to pass the course.

It will be my responsibility to keep you posted of your progress. I will post grades periodically during the marking period. As the year progresses, I will keep you posted of your yearly progress. Each marking period will be worth 25%.

GIVE AN HONEST EFFORT AND WORK HARD

> The first and most important requirement I have of you in this class is a simple one- AN HONEST EFFORT. I will give an honest effort every day to teach you; all I ask in return is to give me an honest effort in the classroom. Even if you hate Chemistry or are not a straight "A" student, I will never, ever fault you if I think you are putting forth an honest effort. Besides, you never know what you might learn.....

ATTENDANCE

If I will not be here on a certain day, I will let you know in advance, unless I am gravely ill, have personal issues, the birth of a child, the moving into a new house, or in an accident. Otherwise, I WILL BE HERE!

YOUR RESPONSIBLITIES

- Come to class prepared. (notebook, pen, pencil, calculator, handouts)
- Take notes and ASK QUESTIONS! The more questions you ask, the more you will learn, and the more interesting the class will be.
- ➤ Get all assignments in **ON TIME!** This includes all make-up work!
- A two-week grace period is given for all make-up tests, quizzes, labs, or assignments. Failure to do so will result in a grade of ZERO for that particular assignment.
- ➤ If you need more help, we can arrange remedial help sessions before or after school. I get to school at 7 AM every day and here until after 2:30 every day after school.
- Since mathematics is the language of science, there will be a lot of "number crunching." I have a limited number of calculators available, but it wouldn't be a bad idea to have your own.
